




AJEET KASLIWAL Mani Mahal, Jaipur-1,


ASHOK KUMAR SHARMA 1409/2, Ram Nagar, Loni Road, Shahdara Delhi-32.

Short statured Bansal is called 'Lala ji' with love has good nature Quite regular in his studies but with a rather poor luck at exams. Plays Cards






DINESH KUMAR GUPTA C/o Raj Lakshmi Mills (Regd.) Ludhiana.

ISHWAR SIMRAN SINGH E. G. 47 Ladowali Road. opp. Khalsa College, Jullundur City (Pb.)


His high pitched hellowing has got him nick named "Mike". Ishwar is very good Hockey player and in cotrast to every carefree aspect of his personality is a serious student too.



'Pappu' as he is called, is quite fair and frank in dealings Interested in politics and spares no newspaper for it. Takes life lightly and less worried about his future career.








